

# Cavendish Close Junior School

## Sports Funding 2014/15

The school received £9423 from the school sports premium money during the academic year 2014/15. When looking at areas for development, Mr Bowen asked the staff and children to complete questionnaires on their own training needs and feeling on school sports. After analysis of the data, the school decided to prioritise these main areas.

### 1. Staff Training/Development

This has taken the form of a whole school INSET on dance and the implementation of a new dance curriculum. Half-Day School INSET (for NQT and TA's) on the teaching of gymnastics and the Derby City Approach. Specific Coaches to work alongside teachers to increase confidence and subject knowledge. These include Alistair Cook (Derby Athletics) who worked alongside Year 4 teachers and TA's, Lloyd Dyson (Lees Brook) who worked alongside Y3 & Y6 staff and Matt Collins (Tesco Skills Coaching) who worked alongside PPA Cover Staff and TA's in Y5. We are also planning work on tennis in the summer term – 2 staff meetings and demo lessons with 'On the Ball' coaching company. We are also paid into an affiliation package with Derby City SSP which allows us limited training opportunities throughout the year.

Total Cost - £3500

### 2. Supply Cover

To cover members of staff when attending PE courses, competitions and other training opportunities. Also to cover Mr Bowen when observing PE lessons in the Summer Term.

Total Cost - £2000

### 3. School clubs

To pay for children to have access to a wider range of opportunities within sport. This included subsidising a dance, tennis, karate and fencing club to encourage different children to become involved in a sport. Also encourage G & T children to further their talents – Mrs Sparks for netball and Mr Dyson for Athletics.

Total Cost - £2000

### 4. Transport Costs

To pay for children to attend competitions, so giving wider opportunities.

Total Cost - £750

### 5. Equipment

To supplement existing curriculum time PE and any new or existing OOH clubs.

Total Cost - £750

The impact of the new funding will be assessed by Mr Bowen near the end of the summer term. He will undertake lesson observations to look at the impact of staff training. Look at the number of pupils involved with OOH school clubs and also the number of new competitions the school has entered.
